| Researched Winnie the Pooh characters according to psychiatrists: Results found in the <a href="#">Canadian Medical Journal</a> and on a <a href="#">blog post</a> . | <p>I plan to base my Remix a Story project on Winnie the Pooh and their “psychological disorders.” I wanted to research to see how much material is already available on this topic. Although the blog post isn’t particularly credible, the information is important. I’m not including it as one of my main sources, but merely as a supplement.</p> <p>The Canadian Medical Journal article is a legitimate source due to the fact that it was published in a scholarly journal. It was also written by licensed clinicians, so the information is based on fact, not speculation.</p> |
| I will be using the <a href="#">1977 movie version</a> of Winnie the Pooh as a source.   | Since this movie came out before the psychiatrists’ evaluation of the characters’ disorders (2000), I’ve decided to base my project on this movie. It has more reviews on Amazon and a higher rating on IMDB than the 2011 version. Although the 2011 version is probably much more modernized, in this scenario it’s better to go with the older and more recognizable 1977 version. The movie is a legitimate source because it was published by Disney and written by A. A. Milne.   |
| I found the <a href="#">IMDb page</a> for the 1977 movie.  | This page provides a lot of background information about the movie. I think it’s necessary to know the basics as well as pertinent quotes from the movie. Although this site functions a lot like Wikipedia, the information presented has been compiled from a variety of resources. I believe it’s reliable because a lot of it is common knowledge.  |
| I found a Winnie the Pooh <a href="#">Wiki page</a> .  | It outlines exactly what occurred in the movie along with character bios and synopses of other Pooh movies. This source is a great place to find more information on Pooh not just from the author’s point of view, but from fans’ as well.   |
| I found a Winnie the Pooh <a href="#">fact sheet</a> .   | Although the author cites his sources as Wikipedia, I think there could be a lot of truth to the things he says. I plan to do background research on each fact to confirm his claims. In the meantime, I think this is a great list to pull from for the project.   |
| Possible asset: <a href="#">Character Poll</a>   | The innocent descriptions of characters may be useful in this project.  |
| Possible asset: <a href="#">Blog post</a> about mental disorders of characters.  | Gives additional information and accompanying GIFS about the characters.  |
